Of Roads and RIDiLs

Last month, Central IHAS distributed EHMS Alert 2019-5: "Pedestrian Struck By Abused Vehicles". One of the actions listed for Management to carry out is, "Site General Manager or designee to engage all personnel during shift changes to communicate this alert, the progressive discipline that will be enforced for not following the rules and the importance of reporting an unsafe act (e.g. RIDiL) to EHS/HS".

RIDiL is a Hazard recognition program that is non-positive. It is not intended to be behavior based.

Do not use RIDiL to turn in your Co-Workers!

The Union wants to clarify to all its members that RIDiL is not a tool to turn in fellow union members, especially if the Co. is threatening Discipline. Any RIDiL's that are submitted naming others, will be voided out.

Unfortunately, The Co. has the ability to access the information voided or not, so please don't enter any Names or plate numbers. The Union does want a safe work site but it needs to be done in a way that doesn't put a Co-Worker's employment in jeopardy. LL 1746 believes that discipline has no place in health and safety.

We want people to recognize unsafe conditions or hazards. Traffic issues should be addressed in poorly designed intersection, poor traffic flow, lack of signage, blocked view, Shift change congestion, not "John Doe driving a Pickup with license plate 12345 on the way".

If you see a traffic hazard, you can submit a RIDiL, but please submit it as a condition not as a behavior. Traffic RIDiL's are filtered up to the pedestrian safety council for review and corrective action.

So what corrective actions are being planned in E.H.?

1) The Company has contracted a firm to assess the roadways and traffic flow for an overall traffic study. Recommendations from the Study will be reviewed for implementation.

No Vote Until NAFTA is Fixed

For more than a quarter-century, North America's working families have raised their voices for better trade policy. The defenders of corporate-dominated trade rules too often portray trade as an end in itself. But trade is not an end, it is a means.

Trade policy must be judged by whether it leads to a just, inclusive and sustainable economy. An economy that works for all, regardless of race, gender or national origin and that in particular lifts up the most vulnerable.

By that measure, NAFTA, which has driven the outsourcing of so many good jobs, especially in aerospace and manufacturing, has been a catastrophic failure. The labor movement has made clear that we need a new deal that makes a real difference in stemming outsourcing and improving workers' lives. Work on this issue is far from complete.

The deal lacks effective provisions to reduce outsourcing in key sectors such as aerospace, manufacturing, autos, processed meat and foods and call centers. Outsourcing remains a key concern for America's working families.
